Top Tips for Home Learning

Do little and often

When learning to read and write numbers, concentrate on a few at a time so that your child experiences success. Try to find ways of helping your child learn the trickier spellings. For example, there is the colour '**red**' hidden in hundred.

Leave the spelling of trickier words such as eight until last and watch out for common errors such as forty (no 'u' needed)

Also remember that hyphens (dashes) are needed between tens and units:

forty- five
thirty-six

In school the children will be using plastic money but they will enjoy handling the real coins as much as possible!

Encourage them to sort their coins by value initially and discuss how many pennies each one is worth.

Can they find ways of making 10p? What about 20p? 50p?

They need to remember that when using coins and values to make different amounts they can only use the coin values we actually have e.g. they cannot make 13p with $10p + 3p$ as we do not have a 3p coin-it would have to be $10p + 2p + 1p$ or $10p + 1p + 1p + 1p$ or any other combination involving 5p coins.
