We will be settling straight back into learning with our topic of Tribes. We will be basing quite a bit of this around the **SF Said** book **The Outlaw Varjak Paw** which is an amazing story which is written in a very exciting style which will allow us to really explore not just story writing but also sentence structure, grammar and punctuation; the nuts and bolts of good writing.

In **Science**, we will look at separating materials with lots of hands on practical experiments in the classroom.

In **Literacy**, we are going to be working on writing and exploring poetry, narrative writing and also persuasive language. I hope we finish the term looking at non-chronological report writing based around the traditions of Christmas!

In **Maths**, we are going through our usual cycle of learning, starting this week with the number system and place-value etc.

History we will be considering differences between groups or 'tribes' of people. In Art we are going to be considering creating images of still life using sketching and water colours. We will also be thinking about creation myths in **RE** and some art may come out of this too.

PE will be on Tuesday afternoons. The children change for PE in school so please send them in their uniform with PE kit in an appropriate bag. We are also going to be swimming this term on a Thursday so please make sure swimming kits are ready for that lesson.

We will continue to use **Class Dojo** for the majority of class notices and information and you can obviously message me with any important information or questions too.
