FAQs:	

Does my child wear uniform for this trip?

Yes. This is for the purposes of safeguarding and clear identification. Children will also be given a Red Residential coat to borrow for the trip and a black day rucksack. The coats help keep the children warm and dry in the January weather and also help staff to identify children in busy areas. The children look extremely smart and we are frequently complimented for their appearance and behaviour on such trips.

London is a busy place even in January - how do you move around in a safe way?

We take safety very seriously on every trip and, for London, run a series of briefings and practice drills with the children about how to walk around in London; how to approach a road crossing and how to cross roads. We run these drills in a very tight fashion so that the children know exactly what to do when we arrive in London. In our experience the children do brilliantly from the moment we alight from the train, because of these practice drills.

All children will have a wristband with emergency numbers which they wear for the duration of the residential.

What about the underground?

For the underground we have a tried and tested method of boarding and disembarking the trains and we practise this with the children in the drills mentioned above. We also liaise with the duty guard upon entering underground stations so that they can alert guards at relevant stations of our intended movements.

Is there any way I can keep an eye on what my child is up to during the trip?

Yes - we will be tweeting at regular intervals and we are currently investigating an "app" which parents can log into for updates. However any use of social media does need to comply with our safeguarding policy and we will therefore update you nearer the time about how we intend on keeping you informed whilst on the trip.

My child has allergies, what do you do about that?

You will be sent home an SOE3 in September to fill out which we will use for the trip.

Which room will my child be in and with whom?

Your child will discuss this with their teacher nearer the time and will give the teacher two names that they would prefer to share with. Normally room allocation is done en route to London with the most uptodate rooming plan from the hotels. We always take into consideration each child's friendships and preferences.
