Curriculum 360 across the Spring Term

Please see below how our **Curriculum 360**, **Academic Excellence**, **Character Education**, **Community**, **Digital and Innovation** is being implemented throughout the curriculum across the school.

Tiddlers

The children settled straight back into being independent learners, taking charge of their own learning through play. We've loved the cold weather exploring the natural elements and the learning provocations it provided. We've been mark making in the frost and exploring ice. This sparked great conversations and learning opportunities.

Academic Excellence

Reception, Year 1 and 2 - Starfish have enjoyed the start of this term's topic, Starry Night. We have been exploring the differences in the world at night compared to during the day and learning about the importance of a good night's sleep. We are very excited to start learning about nocturnal animals next!

Our Jellyfish Class have been fully immersed in their new topic, Bright Lights, Big City, and have enjoyed sharing what they have learnt in their Geography lessons about the United Kingdom and London Landmarks.

Year 3 and 4 - We have started our new topic titled 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles', we have looked at the structure of our planet and have begun to learn about how to identify different types of rocks. We have completed our entries for the Rotary Young Writer Competition, the children wrote poems based on the theme of 'Environment'.

Year 5 and 6 - In Year 5 and 6 we have started our new topic, Sow Grow and Farm and the children have been really engaged, finding out about when different fruit and vegetables are sown and harvested. We have also received some funding from the PTFA to support us in providing hands-on growing experiences in school for our children linked to our topic, so thank you very much PTFA! In Science, we have explored a range of lifecycles and learnt about mammals and their characteristics. We are really enjoying reading the book 'The Mozart Question' and will be using this text as a base for a range of different genres of writing: character descriptions, diaries and newspaper reports.



Character Education

We have been considering ways in which we can be helpful and caring. The whole school is going to be using these virtues to ensure that we look after the new trees which have been kindly donated by our neighbours and planted at the edge of the school field. Our upcoming Virtues are Critical Thinking and Honesty. We will be exploring these in our assemblies followed up with lots of discussion back in class.

We are also learning about how we can develop into Global Changemakers, young people who will go out and make a difference in the world. As part of our Character Education journey, children will take part in 6 Inspirational

We have enjoyed involving our parents in our learning via dojo and Tapestry and will be holding some parent workshops and events for each year group this term. It's always lovely to welcome parents into school so watch this space!

Year 3 and 4 - Both classes spent some time at the beach to start our new topic and all the children took part in a beach clean while we were there. The children were surprised to see the large amount of rubbish they were able to collect in just a short time!

Year 5 and 6 - Children in Year 5 enjoyed learning the skills to become a Play Leader, supporting our school community and setting up activities that are accessible for all. The 4 key qualities of a successful Play Leader are - communication, safety, fair and fun!

Digital and Innovation

Reception, Year 1 and 2 - Starfish class loved creating their own rocket ship mechanisms in our Design and Technology afternoon and learnt all about how to create their own moving pictures! Year 1 and 2 have also been designers and engineers this week, designing their own magnetic games during their Science lessons, some were a real challenge!

Year 3 and 4 - We were all innovative in our story telling based on interesting objects which were found at the beach, we had to use our imagination and improvisation skills to create stories! Year 4 have also begun their exciting art and story telling project with Beaford Arts. We are continuing to develop our use of our Chrome Books and have been trying to use our Class Dojo portfolios to record our reading and thoughts about what we have been reading.

Year 5 and 6 - We are learning to edit our writing effectively on our Chromebooks and to use the comment tools to give advice to each other to help the editing process. Year 6 are also using their computers to manipulate and create 3D shapes and images on the screen using an online software called Tinkercad. Year 5 are leaning about computer systems and networks and finding out how computer controlled systems and digital innovation is used in today's world of work.

We are closely monitoring the situation and have worked hard to keep the school running as normal. 
