


Whole School Book


The Promise by Nicola Davies

All the classes read the book 'The Promise' by Nicola Davies. The book was introduced to the whole school in our assembly on Monday morning when we watched an animation of the book which can be seen here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ea7W4EfhZGk 'The Promise' is a beautiful picture book about the power of nature. It tells the story of a young girl living on the streets of a city who steals to survive. She tries to steal the handbag from an old woman who gives it to her if she makes a promise to 'plant them all'. The bag is full of acorns and the book shows the girl planting them and transforming the city. In our assembly on Friday afternoon all the classes shared what they had done linked to 'The Promise', it was lovely to see the children's beautiful artwork and hear some of their writing.
